

Data Protection Agreement

The client acknowledges, in accordance with the German Federal Data Protection Act: Section 33, Paragraph 1, that tolingo GmbH, subject to the current legal regulations, may collect, handle, process and impart the personal data of the client to third parties, to the extent that this is permitted by law for the grounding of the contractual relationship and the lawful execution of the necessary services and billing.

In the context of data collection, processing and use, cookies will be applied. With cookies, a data record is generated by our web server and sent to the computer which is currently communicating with our web server i.e. that of the client. The data record is then filed in the cookie folder of the web browser. tolingo applies cookies when a user attempts to log into the website. Cookies make it easier to ascertain the frequency of use and the number of users for the website. Online users can customize their web browser so that all cookies are allowed or rejected, or that a notification message is displayed when a cookie is created. As the utilization of tolingo's online service requires client registration, the tolingo website cannot be used when cookies are blocked by the client's web browser.

If you have supplied tolingo with personal data, you are able to delete this data at any time. In this case it is sufficient to send an e-mail to support@tolingo.com. Data for billing or bookkeeping purposes is exempt from deletion.

Google Analytics

This website uses Google Analytics, a web analytics service provided by Google, Inc. ("Google"). Google Analytics uses "cookies", which are text files placed on your computer, to help the website analyze how users use the site. The information generated by the cookie about your use of the website (including your IP address) will be transmitted to and stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google will use this information for the purpose of evaluating your use of the website, compiling reports on website activity for website operators and providing other services relating to website activity and internet usage.

Google may also transfer this information to third parties where required to do so by law, or where such third parties process the information on Google's behalf. Facebook Social Plugins

This web site uses social plugins ("plugins") of facebook.com social network, which is operated by Facebook Inc., 1601 S. California Ave, Palo Alto, CA 94304, USA ("Facebook"). These plugins are specified by a Facebook logo or the additional information "Facebook Social Plugin".

When visiting a web site of our Internet portal which includes such plugin, your browser will establish a direct connection to Facebook servers.

Facebook directly transfers the plugin content to your browser which integrates the latter into the site, enabling Facebook to receive information about your having accessed the respective page of our web site.

For this purpose, the Internet address of the visited site (your IP address included) is transferred to a USA-based Facebook server where the data are stored.

In general, it is impossible for Facebook to identify you, above all because of the dynamic address which is usually assigned to you by your access provider when surfing the web.

According to information published by Facebook, the relevant data are neither further processed nor disclosed to third parties. After a period of three months, these data are anonymized in order to prevent linking the information to your identity.

This doesn't apply, if you are logged in to Facebook when visiting our site, because Facebook is able to assign this access to your Facebook account then. In case you interact with the plugins, for example, activate the "I like" button, or make a comment, your browser transfers the relating information directly to Facebook where they are stored.
